 - A. Jesus didn't come to win the way we define winning. He came to do something different.
 - B. Jesus came to love, not to win.
 - C. It's not an anti-political thing; it's an allegiance thing—an allegiance to live and love and lead like Jesus did... above winning a point.
- III. The majority of the U.S. population knows enough about Jesus to know he wouldn't react the way many Christians are reacting today.
 - A. The moment we (Christians) step into culture wars, we lose in terms of what Jesus modeled for us and what God has called us to do.
 - B. Many Christians today have a tendency to lead with their beliefs rather than their values, which creates division and conflict.
- IV. "The sad truth is, the fear fueling our division has been created, cultivated, and stoked by those who benefit from it." —Andy Stanley, Not in It to Win It.
 - A. Political leaders benefit from division.
 - 1. The message of politics says, "The goal is to always look like we're losing, but you can help me win, which will help you."
 - 2. The goal is to make individuals fear the other party by stating if they win, something bad is going to happen to you.
 - B. Find common ground. Democracy only works when we move to the middle, because different perspectives are needed in order to come out with the best possible solution.
- IV. To make the world great, adopt Jesus' definition of great.
 - A. Jesus said, "Whoever wants to be great among you must be your servant."
 - B. Any time we see this kind of servant leadership, we admire it and aspire to lead like it because we know it's the best way forward.
